To Use As Treats for your Dog

This is for our new club members; a special "cake" for your dog.

Other club members have seen this before but I am sure you will not mind being reminded again!

### **Liver Cake**

½ lb. Liver (ox liver is cheapest)

6 slightly heaped tablespoons plain flour

6 Tablespoons Milk

1 Egg

Garlic Salt if desired

Pre-heat oven to 180C

Thoroughly liquidise the liver.

Add remaining ingredients and liquidise again.

Pour into a greased and floured sandwich tin and bake for approx. 13 minutes.

Allow to cool for a short time, then turn out onto a cooling tray and cut into cubes.

Keep in the fridge. They will also freeze well until required.
